The Black Mountain Boys of Pocohantas County are sons of their soil, part of an extended community that includes old-time fiddlers, singers of unaccompanied British ballads dating back to the eighteenth century, parlor pianists, congregations who favor a cappella hymnody, congregations who do not and country and rock bands. They embrace bluegrass tunes that connect with the uplands South, like "Lonesome Ruben" and "Midnight Storm" by the Stanley Brothers. They are well known for their "high lonesome" sound of classic bluegrass. Richard Hefner, leader and banjo player has been in the band since it's inception in 1968. The other members are Jeff Hefner, Chris Nickell and Mike Smith – all West Virginia natives.

Against The Grain came together in 1994. Danny Reynolds plays mandolin, sings lead and writes some original songs for the group. He lives in Bedford, Virginia. Mark Holt on the fiddle is from Rustburg, Virginia. David Goode on the guitar is from Lynchburg, Virginia. Richard Greer, from Hardy, Virginia has been playing the guitar for over fifty years. They have shared the stage with many great bluegrass bands...some are J. D. Crow, Nothin Fancy, Rhonda Vincent, The Whites and many others. Against the Grain covers a wide variety of music ranging from gospel and traditional to country and rock.
